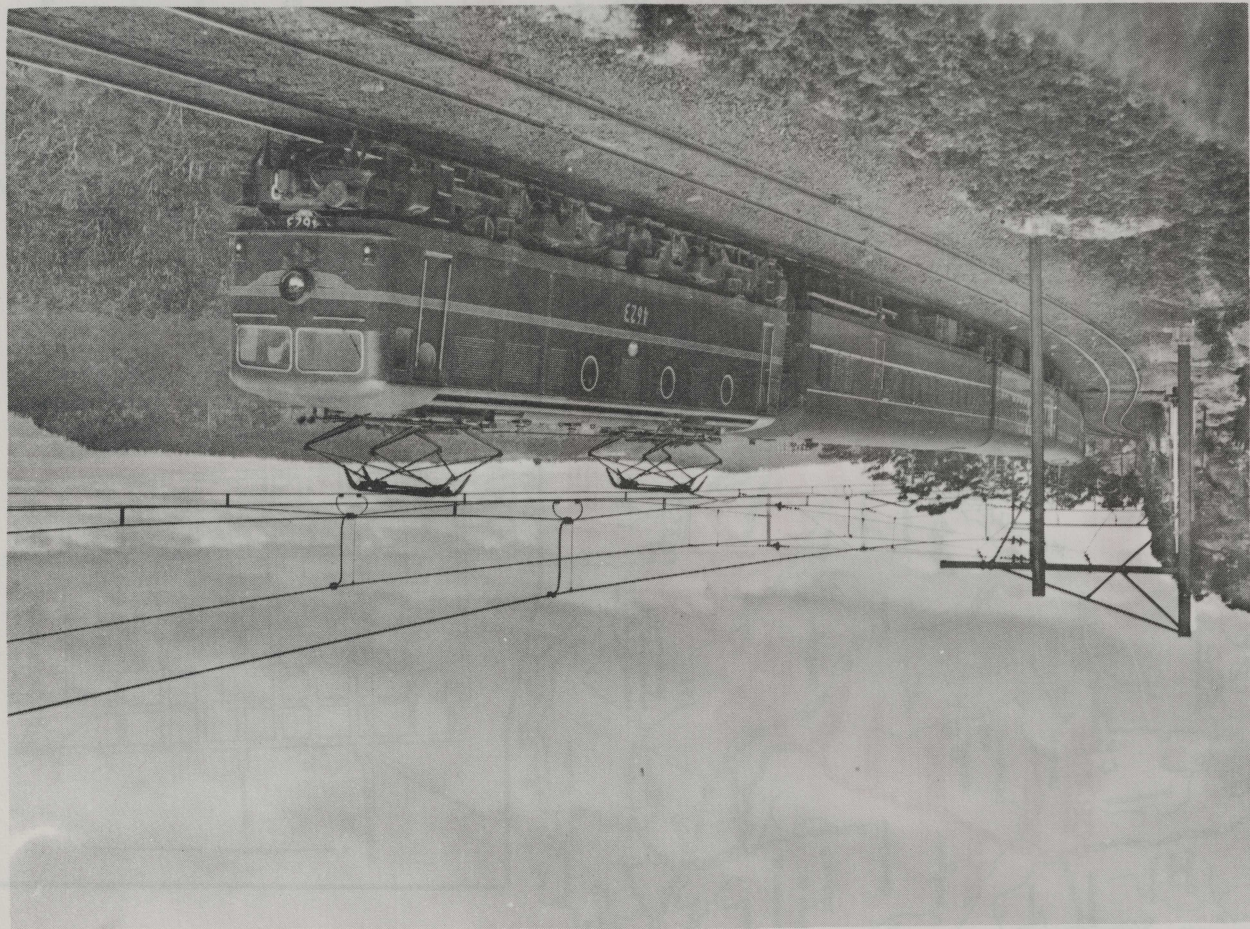


TRAVEL BY TRAIN TO ORANGE

Central West Express between Blackheath and Mt. Victoria.



Orange, in the Central West of New South Wales, is 200 miles inland from Sydney. The Orange district is one of Australia's richest mixed farming areas and is famous for its cherry crops.

Tourists from Sydney can visit Orange under ideal travelling conditions because a Central West Express provides a service in each direction every day excepting Sunday. This modern air-conditioned train leaves Sydney at 7.50 a.m. and arrives Orange at 2.6 p.m. On the return journey the train departs Orange at 2.38 p.m. and arrives Sydney by 8.52 p.m. Return fare for adults is 102s. 2d. first-class and 70s. 8d. second-class. Seat reservation costs 3s. 0d. extra each way, and may be made up to one month ahead of travel. Light refreshments are obtainable on this express at reasonable rates.

Also, every now and then, a special one-day tour is made from Sydney to Orange on Sundays in an air-conditioned express. The passengers on these low-cost tours are taken for a motor trip through the City of Orange to the Pinnacle and Lake Canobolas, the cherry-growing district, and Duntroon League golf course.
